


## How can I get involved?

**PROJECT INFORMATION**

## Project Background

The Puntu Pirni Palya (PPP) Project is **by First Nations people, about First Nations people, for First Nations people**. The PPP scaffolds men's wellbeing through tradition, culture, and language. Men can make artefacts in the mobile workshop or drop in for a yarn.

This project is rooted in the healing power of language, culture, tradition, and connection. Goldfields men engage through yarning, cultural practices, and traditional techniques. The project fosters resilience, strengthen cultural identity, and creates pathways for lasting positive change.

The project scaffolds Cultural Stewards by providing resources to facilitate the workshops in their communities.

PPP provides;

- A mobile fully-equipped workshop,
- materials to run artefact-making sessions, and lead yarning within communities, and
- workshop coordinators.


The artefact-making uses traditional practices to create safe spaces for men to connect, share, and enjoy wellbeing.

## Cultural Stewards

Adhering to traditional protocols in each community underpins the PPP Project. A community based Cultural Steward will run the workshop in each town and community. The Cultural Stewards are responsible for preserving the value of traditions for their communities.

## 5 Underpinning Values

The project's work is underpinned by 5 values that ensure First Nations worldview, and respects all levels of First Nation's culture.



## Artefact-Making

The PPP Project will assist in sustainably sourcing the required natural resources to support the artefact workshops.



## PPP Communities

The PPP Project will be visiting each Aboriginal Community and town in the Goldfields area 2 - 3 times a year.
